

- Presentation on Prescription Drug Affordability:
 Krystle Able, from the <u>Illinois Alliance for Retired</u>
 Americans (IARA), spoke about the Prescription Drug
 Affordability Board. A surprising fact highlighted was that pharmaceutical companies spend more money on advertising than research and development.

Legislative Update

The Illinois General Assembly is in the last weeks of the Spring Legislative Session and they will be determining key legislation and the state budget that has an impact on Public Education. Proposals for bills have progressed through the House and Senate Committees including expanding teacher tenure eligibility and affording student teachers to be granted stipend pay for their service. Other key legislation includes paid plan time, limits on standardized testing for elementary students, expanded placement for high school courses, enhancement for supporting students experiencing homelessness, and freedom of speech protections in the workplace. Some initiatives being explored are the improvement of mental health resources for students, addressing climate change in education, and the implementation of school bus electrification grants. The Spring Session is expected to conclude on May 24. Any updates will be communicated on the IFT Under The Dome webpage: https://www.ift-aft.org/news/categories/under-the-dome
